

Paper Fan



Materials Used:

12" x 30" piece of heavy weight white paper

Acrylic paints: one color for petals

bright yellow for the centers

bright green for the stems and leaves

kid's craft brush

ruler

ribbon

popsicle stick

paper towels

pencil

Aleene's Designer Tacky Glue

hole punch

water for washing brushes

Instructions:

1. Lay the paper on the work surface with the long sides at the top and bottom. Leave 3" at the bottom and 1" at the top unpainted. Dip the brush into the color of paint that you want for the flower petals. Stand the bristles on the paper and move the handle of the brush toward the center of the flower. The bristles will spread out slightly and make one petal. Repeat in a circle making 5 or 7 petals per flower. Try to keep them close but not touching. Scatter flowers across the paper. Dip the handle end of the brush in yellow paint for the center of the flowers and make a dot in the center of the petals. You may need to make several smaller dots to be certain that you touch each petal. With the bristles and green paint, draw a thin line that connects 2 or 3 flowers for a stem. Make it curve a little. Paint stems for your flowers until every one has a stem. Make leaves the same way you made the separate petals, scattering them around on the stems. Let the design dry.
2. Place the fan with the painted side facing down. Starting at one short end, make pencil marks 1" apart along both long edges. Use the ruler to connect the marks.
3. Lay the painted side down with one short end toward you. Take the short end farthest away from you and bring it toward you. Fold the paper along the first line from step 2. Take the same short end and move it away from you, folding the paper along the second line. Continue folding the paper back and forth, using the lines as guides.
4. Put glue in between the folds on the right side, about 2" up from the bottom. This makes the handle. Tie the ribbon around the handle and put a little glue under the knot to hold it in place.
5. Use a hole punch to put 3 holes in each section along the top edge.
6. Spread glue on one side of a popsicle stick. Turn the fan with the painted side down. Place a stick in the first fold near the bottom where the handle is glued. Place another stick in the fold on the other edge. Repeat with the other 3 sticks, placing one in the middle of the fan and the others about halfway between the middle and the edge.
