method is okay. Going through the bumps give a prettier edge at the beginning of the work that matches the edge at the beginning. (Example of each)

4. For demonstration purposes I'm going to go through the bumps on the back of the chain. Find the

second bump from the hook and stick the hook through. Pull up a loop. Wrap the yarn over the hook and pull it through both loops on the hook. This is the first sc on the row. Work a sc in each bump across the row. Because you skipped the first bump, you will have only 10 stitches. Count to make sure.

5. At the end of the row, turn the work. You make one ch at the beginning of the row. Insert your hook under both top loops into the first stitch (the one at the base of the chain). Pull up a loop. Wrap the yarn over the hook and pull it through both loops on the hook. This is the first sc on the row. Work a sc in each bump across the row. Because you skipped the first bump, you will have only 10 stitches. Count to make sure.
